Yearly attendance is between 65,000 – 85,000 with an estimated 90,000 people attending this year. This event is held at Liberty Park in downtown Salt Lake City, Utah which is the ending point of Utah's largest parade, the Days of '47 Parade which is also held on July 24th in the morning. This year's event will be the biggest yet as July 24th falls on a Saturday which allows more people to attend.

As a contributor and sponsor of this year's Native American Celebration in the Park you will receive exposure at our Live Music Entertainment Stage and our Competition Powwow which are the two largest spectator attractions. Sponsors are recognized on stage and during the Powwow many times. Native American Celebration in the Park – Event Overview

Celebrating our 12 Year Anniversary

July 24th, 2006 – Pioneer Day

Liberty Park, 500 East 900 South, Salt Lake City, Utah

The Native American Celebration in the Park (NACIP) is a community event with attendees from Utah and surrounding states. The theme is, “Walking Together” to showcase the Native American culture and encourage different cultures to join together in celebration.



Main Attractions at the Celebration

1. Intertribal Contest Powwow: Area A
2. Food Booths: Areas A, B & C
3. Arts & Crafts: Areas B & C
4. Children's Corner: Area A
5. Live Music – Multi-Ethnic Entertainment Stage: Area C

Intertribal Contest Powwow

Colorful Native American dancers compete for top prizes in four different dance categories and four age groups. Winners receive a cash prize ranging from \$1 to \$200. Powwow competition begins at 11:00 a.m. with the Grand Entry and ends at 8:00 p.m. with awards. NACIP long-time supporter Mayor Rocky Anderson will dance to a special Honor Song at 2:00 p.m. The Intertribal Contest Powwow is always popular with the spectators.

Food Booths

Native American foods and delightful foods from many cultures are presented at booths throughout the festival.

Arts & Crafts Booths

Native American artisans present their hand-crafted treasures along with hand-made arts & crafts of many varieties. NACIP encourages hand-crafted products and offers a discount to artisans selling their own creations. Many professional products and services will also be on display.

Children's Corner & Other Activities for Kids

At the Children's Corner there will be instructors and materials for children to make simple crafts they take home. There will also be other games and activities for kids such as: a wide assortment of large inflatable games, a rock-climbing tower, children's playground and many water activities.

Live Music

Native American entertainers and entertainers from many lands will perform on the Multi-Ethnic Stage located in Area C. There is always a large crowd gathered to hear the entertainers with crowds increasing throughout the day. The last song is synchronized with the start of the fireworks to create a perfect grand finale for the Native American Celebration in the Park.

Children's Corner sponsors help provide materials for children's arts & crafts which provides a special tie between your company and support for families. Receive a large 4' x 4' banner space at the children's corner, at the powwow arena and the entertainment stage to promote your company. Medium sized logo on all newspaper celebration advertisements and NACIP website. Company product/service announcements throughout the day at the powwow and the entertainment stage and a special Indian honor song during the powwow.
